What is governance?

- Refers to **how an organization is run**, including the various **processes**, systems, and controls.
- A governance team, or **Board**, being able to strategically direct and lead an organization.
- Includes being able to make key decisions regarding priorities and roles to define expectations and delegate authority, and to adhere to legal requirements.
- It is **not** about **operational details**.
- Its application servers to realize organisational goals.

What is good governance?

- Good governance is also about achieving desired results in a manner consistent with organizational values and accepted social norms.
- Particularly true in the world of sport where **our product is people** in particular, our athletes and their experience.
- Sport governance must meld the passion and dedication of volunteers into a focused governance team.
- The governance team must operate with integrity and strive to enhance the experiences of the participants, and the performance and reputation of the sport.

Why is governance important?

- Participants have high expectations
- Organizations need to be accountable and credible
- Funding partners expect professionalism
- Sport environment is complex
- Demands on leaders are significant
- Direction-setting is fundamental to success
- Staff can thrive when supported by strong governance
- More time to focus on what is important to your club
- Clarity to all on what is being asked of them
- Direction that goes beyond a single individual
